BILL NO. SB 1

Analysis

This bill makes it a class A misdemeanor to sell or transfer a switchblade or gravity knife to a person under 18 years of age unless they have prior written permission from their parents. The bill goes on to make possession of these knives by someone under 16 years of age a class B misdemeanor. It also reserves the authority to regulate knives to the state with some limited exceptions for municipalities.
This legislation is not expected to cause a dramatic increase in convictions which would require incarceration and, therefore, there is no fiscal impact to the Department.
