Analysis

Senate Bill 79 will shift the oversight of the sport fishing guide licensing program to a nine member Sport Fishing Guide Services Board housed within the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development, and establish two new licensing categories. The logbook program will stay housed within ADF&G.

The cost of operating the existing logbook program in ADF&G is approximately \$400.0 annually. Adding two new license categories will not increase program costs because of the requirement in SB 79 to administer the logbook program electronically. The cost savings associated with moving to an electronic logbook program will offset the additional costs of adding two additional licensing categories to the program. ADF&G assumes fees will be set to generate enough revenue to the General Fund to cover the cost of administering the entire program, and that \$400.0 in interagency receipts will be received by ADF&G from DCCED via a Reimbursable Services Agreement.

Funding is necessary to upgrade the current logbook program from the current system to being entirely electronic. Currently ADF&G has a capital budget project going through the legislative process for licensing modernization. Updating the logbook program is contained within the overall scope of work for this project and therefore no additional funding is necessary.

Regulations will need to be both updated to reflect the new labeling of the two existing licensing categories and promulgated for the two new licensing categories established within SB 79. In addition, regulations based on the statutes being repealed in SB 79 will need to be repealed along with those statutes and we anticipate this should be completed by January 1, 2016.

With a January 1, 2014 effective date we have adjusted FY14 to reflect the half of the fiscal year.

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
