FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2013 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. HB 168

Analysis

HB 168 amends the definition of travel insurance and authorizes a person selling travel services to transact the business of travel insurance on behalf of and under the direction of someone who holds a travel insurance limited producer license.
A limited producer license is one that allows an individual to sell a specific line of insurance. In this case, travel insurance.
In November 2011 the National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC) adopted a definition and standards for a limited lines travel producer that individual states could implement in order to create a uniform license structure. The language in HB 168 follows the approved and uniform language adopted by the NAIC, and the definition of travel insurance is added under Section 2 of the bill.
There is no anticipated fiscal impact to the Division of Insurance from this bill.
