BILL NO. HB 88

Analysis

House Bill 88 seeks to update state health, education and labor policy by removing the terms "mental retardation" and "mentally retarded" and replace them with "intellectual and developmental disabilities". Section one of this bill will amend a section of the Board of Nursing statutes in Title 8. No other sections of this bill effect the Department.

The Division of Corporations, Business and Professional Licensing does not anticipate a fiscal impact from this legislation.
