Summary of Changes from HB 68 ver A to CS 68 ver W

The first change is an amendment to AS 14.56.120(a), and it came at the request of the librarians in the State Library: changing the number of hard copies of reports delivered to library from four to five. The library holds one copy of each report, circulates one, and sends three other copies to UA, ARLIS, and the Library of Congress.

The second change is an amendment to AS 14.56.170, and it allows members of the public to request print copies of reports from the state library free of charge. Because of the typically low volume of requests for reports, and the proportionally small costs of reproducing them at the library, allowing the state to absorb the costs of reproduction still results in cost savings, while ensuring that public information remains free for everyone. The number of reports able to be requested each day is capped at five per person.
