## **Analysis**

HB 83 would repeal and reenact AS 09.68.130. The bill requires the Alaska Judicial Council to periodically collect and evaluate information relating to the resolution of civil litigation. The information collected may include, among other things, general case information; a description of settlement or judgments; and attorney's fees. Parties to civil litigation must submit this information within 30 days of a written request from the Judicial Council. The bill also would repeal two related court rules—conditionally effective upon a two-thirds vote of the Legislature requiring parties to submit the foregoing information to the Judicial Council. Certain types of litigation (e.g. divorce, adoption, estate matters, and administrative appeals) are exempt from the reporting requirement. We note that under both the current version of AS 09.68.130 and the related court rules, parties to litigation are automatically required to report specified information to the Judicial Council within 30 days of case resolution. HB 83 would shift that burden to the Judicial Council, making the information available to the Judicial Council only upon its written request. We foresee no fiscal impacts to the Department of Law from this bill.
