Analysis

Under AS 23.40.225 and AS 42.40.880, bargaining unit employees may file a claim for religious exemption "based on tenets or teachings of a church or religious body of which the employee is a member". When these claims are granted, the affected employee's payment to the labor organization for dues and other fees is contributed to a charity of the <u>labor organization's</u> choice "not affiliated with a religious, labor, or employee organization." This bill would give the affected employee, rather than the labor organization, the authority to choose the charity for contribution purposes under these statutes.
There is no fiscal impact to the Department of Labor and Workforce Development anticipated as a result of this legislation.
