BILL NO. SB 111

Analysis

This bill prohibits the manufacture, sale, or distribution of upholstered furniture or a children's item if such items contain certain identified flame retardant chemicals; provides an exemption for resale of such items; requires upholstered furniture or a children's item containing flame retardant chemicals to be labeled as such; and establishes civil penalties for violation of these requirements.

Should this legislation pass, there would be no fiscal impact to the Division of Fire and Life Safety.
