## FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

# 1 "An Act relating to reporting of workplace injuries to the division of labor standards

2 and safety."

## **3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:**

#### 4 **\* Section 1.** AS 18.60.058(a) is amended to read:

5 (a) In the event of an employment accident that is fatal to an employee [ONE 6 OR MORE EMPLOYEES] or that results in an employee's [THE] in-patient 7 hospitalization or an employee's loss of an eye or an amputation [OF ONE OR 8 MORE EMPLOYEES], the employer shall report the accident. The report must be 9 **made** [ORALLY] by telephone or in person to the nearest office of the division of 10 labor standards and safety or by telephone to the federal toll-free number provided by 11 the division. The report must relate the name of the establishment, the location of the 12 accident, the time of the accident, a contact person and the telephone number of the 13 contact person, a brief description of the accident, the number of fatalities or **injured** 14 [HOSPITALIZED] employees, and the extent of any injuries. The report must be

1	made immediately but in no event later than eight hours after receipt by the employer
2	of information that the accident has occurred. However, if the employer first receives
3	information of a fatality, [OR] in-patient hospitalization, loss of an eye or an
4	amputation [OF ONE OR MORE EMPLOYEES] eight or more hours after the
5	accident but not later than [WITHIN] 30 days after the accident, the employer must
6	make the report <b>not later than</b> [WITHIN] eight hours after receiving <b>the</b> information
7	[OF THE FATALITY OR IN-PATIENT HOSPITALIZATION]. This subsection does
8	not apply to an employer that first receives information of a fatality <sub>1</sub> [OR] in-patient
9	hospitalization, loss of an eye, or an amputation more than 30 days after the
10	accident.
