# FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

### 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

- \* **Section 1.** The uncodified law of the State of Alaska is amended by adding a new section
- 5 to read:
- 6 LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the legislature that, to the extent
- 7 practicable, the Alaska Court System remove from its public Internet website records of
- 8 criminal cases that were disposed of before the effective date of this Act by acquittal of all
- 9 charges, by dismissal of all charges, or by acquittal of some charges and dismissal of the
- remaining charges, to the extent that AS 22.35.030, enacted by sec. 2 of this Act, requires that
- 11 the records may not be published.
- \* Sec. 2. AS 22.35 is amended by adding a new section to read:
- 13 Sec. 22.35.030. Records concerning criminal cases resulting in acquittal or
- dismissal. The state may not publish a court record of a criminal case on the Internet if

I	60 days have elapsed from the date of acquittal or dismissal and
2	(1) the defendant was acquitted of all charges filed in the case;
3	(2) all criminal charges against the defendant in the case have been
4	dismissed; or
5	(3) the defendant was acquitted of some of the criminal charges in the
6	case and the remaining charges were dismissed.
7	* Sec. 3. The uncodified law of the State of Alaska is amended by adding a new section to
8	read:
9	APPLICABILITY. AS 22.35.030, enacted by sec. 2 of this Act, applies to criminal
10	charges concluded on or after the effective date of this Act by dismissal or by acquittal of the
11	defendant.
12	* Sec. 4. This Act takes effect October 1, 2015.
