## FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

## STATE OF ALASKA 2016 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

## **Analysis**

If enacted into law, as drafted, would create a statutory scheme for adjudicating and disposing of claims for wrongful conviction and imprisonment. The administration of the process for addressing such claims would fall within the Department of Administration. The bill creates a statutory method for addressing such claims. The bill mandates a schedule of compensation for approved claims, which, if enacted, would, as to approved claims, impact the state treasury.		
The bill does not affect the operations or activities of the Office of Public Advocacy (OPA) as such, but would affect the clients of OPA attorneys who have been wrongfully convicted, imprisoned and present such claims. A zero fiscal note, as to OPA, is appropriate.
