FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

BILL NO. SB 161

Analysis

The bill amends AS 08.18.116 to require the department to conduct an investigation upon notification from an owner builder proposed under section 3. The investigation would be focused on determining whether the owner builder violated AS 08.18. (In this context, "department" means Department of Labor and Workforce Development or Department of Commerce and Economic Development.)

The bill amends AS 08.18.161 to clarify that the exemption for a person who performs work on their own property or residence only applies to work on existing structures.

The bill amends AS 08.18.161 to clarify that an owner builder may also perform independent work and maintain the exemption from contractor licensing and adds a condition that requires an owner builder who advertises the sale or sells the structure during construction or within two years after construction ends must file a notification form with the department. (In this context, "department" means Department of Commerce and Economic Development.)

The department does not anticipate a fiscal impact as a result of this legislation.
