Analysis

SB91 makes numberous changes to many criminal laws and procedures that will largely impact the executive branch agencies involved in criminal justice issues. Section 11.46.982 will require the Alaska Judicial Council to publish a report each February 1, (to be distributed electronically to the described agencies and on the judicial council's website) calculating the increase in value, if any, of property or services as an element of an offense (as described in the bill) from a base value of \$2,000, to reflect the change in the Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers for the Anchorage metropolitan area compiled by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, United States Department of Labor, from the second half of 2016. The Council anticipates this annual task can be accomplished within its normal workload. The research and report required are within the capabilities and scope of duties that the staff regularly performs. The Council will not require additional staff or resources to meet the bill's requirements, and therefore submits this zero fiscal note.
