

Long-term Employment / Employment without Oil and Gas


Non Oil & Gas Employment

Total Employment






ECONOMIC TRENDS – GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT



INVESTMENTS

Program Overview:

- 11 loan funds with a total principal outstanding exceeding \$200 million
 - 4 fishing-related loan programs
 - 3 small business loan programs
 - 1 bulk fuel loan program
 - 1 capstone avionics loan program
 - 1 alternative energy loan program
 - 1 mariculture loan program

Program Cost:

Funding is self-generated via the revolving loan fund revenues







BUSINESS RETENTION AND EXPANSION

Program Overview:

- 31 partner organizations
- 70 individuals
- 10 communities
- 475 business contacts in the BRE software system
- 253 business surveys completed

- Initial startup costs for this program were funded by a federal grant
- Approximately \$6,000 yearly, plus staff time



MADE IN ALASKA

Program Overview:

- 1,007 participating businesses with 1,173 products permitted in 80 communities throughout the state
- 45% of permit holder product sales is attributed to the program
- For every \$1 spent by the State, \$68 was earned by permit holders

- \$125,000 yearly includes staff costs and promotional materials.
- \$40,036 generated during FY15




FY17 BUDGET
