FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2016 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. HB 303

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The financial impact of this bill on the Violent Crimes Compensation Board is indeterminate but potentially could significantly reduce available funding. The bill will change the way in which the permanent fund dividend is calculated, and it is more likely than not that the amount of the dividend will decrease as a result. Accordingly, the bill is likely to have the effect of significantly reducing the current source of state funding for the Violent Crimes Compensation Board (appropriation from the PFD fund) without any indication of how that funding would be replaced.
This appropriation is not the only source of funding for the Violent Crimes Compensation Board. The Board also receives an annual federal grant. However, this is a formula grant, predicated on the prior year's certified state expenditures. Thus, if less state money is available to spend on grants to victims of crime, so federal funding would decrease the following year, hence zero revenue in FY16 onwards.
