BILL NO. HB 117

Analysis

This bill requires all law enforcement agencies within the State to inventory the number of untested sexual assault examination kits and report that number to the attorney general. The bill also directs the attorney general to prepare a plan for addressing the backlog of untested sexual assault examination kits, as well as a plan to prevent a backlog. There is no fiscal impact to the Crime Lab.
