#### RECOMMENDATIONS

The House Finance Budget Subcommittee for the Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development submits a recommended operating budget for FY17 to the House Finance Committee as follows:

**Fund Source:** (dollars are in thousands)

Unrestricted General Funds (UGF)	\$17,306.0
Designated General Funds (DGF)	\$40,293.4
Other Funds	\$60,168.2
Federal Funds	\$20,044.9
Total	\$137,812.5

The Unrestricted General Fund difference from the FY17 Adjusted Base to the House Subcommittee budget recommendation is a reduction of \$8,087.2, which is a decrease of 31.8 percent.

The House Finance Budget Subcommittee for the Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development held six meetings with the Department. The Subcommittee reviewed the FY17 budget request and took the following actions:

## ACTION TO GOVERNOR'S PROPOSAL

- Corporations, Business and Professional Licensing Occupational Licensing Examiners
   The Governor requested \$264.3 Receipt Supported Services for 3 PFT positions. The Subcommittee reduced it to \$175.3 Receipt Supported Services for 2 PFT positions and identified the funding is for a one-time increment.
- Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office Marijuana Regulation Funding & Local Option Education and Compliance Outreach

The Governor requested \$1,574.4 UGF and the Subcommittee appropriated \$1,474.40 UGF as a one-time increment. In other subcommittee actions below, the Subcommittee also approved \$100.0 in program receipt authority. The Subcommittee denied the local option education and compliance outreach position and associated funding.

Alaska Seafood Marketing Institute – Seafood Marketing
 The subcommittee accepted the reduction of \$1,500.6 UGF; however, it did not accept the replacement of \$1,500.6 in Statutory Designated Program Receipts. ASMI funding was further reduced by 30 percent or \$1,028.5 UGF (see item 11 below).

## ADDITIONAL SUBCOMMITTEE ACTION

1. Community and Regional Affairs – Named Recipient Grant to Alaska Air Carriers Association Inc. – Medallion Foundation: (\$250.0) UGF

The Subcommittee has determined that funding will not be available for this named recipient grant.

- 2. Corporations, Business and Professional Licensing Added Intent Language
  - It is the intent of the legislature that the Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development set license fees approximately equal to the cost of regulation per AS 08.01.065(c). Further, it is the intent of the legislature that the Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development annually submit, by November 1st, a six year report to the legislature in a template developed by Legislative Finance Division. The report is to include at least the following information for each licensing board: revenues from license fees; revenues from other sources; expenditures by line item, including separate reporting for investigative costs, administrative costs, departmental and other cost allocation plans; number of licensees; carryforward balance; and potential license fee changes based on statistical analysis.
- 3. Economic Development Eliminated Grant Funding for ARDORS: (\$774.1)UGF AS 44.33.896 is repealed on July 1, 2016. The funding is eliminated for FY17.
- **4.** Economic Development Deleted 4 Positions in Economic Development: (\$467.4)UGF Deleted four Economic Development Specialist II, Option A positions. The Department has identified the following impacts due to deleting these four positions:
  - Tourism Industry Development Eliminated
  - Made in Alaska Reduced Services
  - Alaska Preference Programs Reduced Services

- Business Retention and Expansion Reduced Services
- Seafood Industry Development Eliminated
- Timber Industry Development Reduced Services
- Unmanned Aircraft Systems Industry Development Eliminated
- Maritime Industry Development Eliminated
- Alaska Economic Performance Report Eliminated
- Alaska Artist Directory Eliminated
- Business Assistance Eliminated
- Promotion and Support of Small Agricultural Businesses Eliminated
- 5. Tourism Marketing and Development Reduced Tourism Marketing Funding: (\$1,358.0)UGF The Subcommittee accepted the Governor's proposed reduction of \$2,365.3 UGF, the deletion of two positions, as well as, transferring the funding authorization for a named recipient grant to Alaska Travel Industry Association. In addition, the Subcommittee recommends a decrement equivalent to 30 percent of the UGF, bringing the total for Tourism Marketing to \$3,170.2.

## 6. Tourism Marketing and Development – Added Intent Language

It is the intent of the legislature that the Tourism Marketing Board develops a plan moving Tourism Marketing towards a self-sustaining program and presents the plan to the legislature by January 1, 2017.

# 7. Tourism Marketing and Development – Removed Carryforward Language

Carryforward language is no longer necessary; the Alaska Travel Industry Association will collect receipts directly.

The amount appropriated by this appropriation includes the unexpended and unobligated balance on June 30, 2016, of the Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development, Tourism Marketing & Development, statutory designated program receipts from the sale of advertisements, exhibit space and all other receipts collected on behalf of the State of Alaska for tourism marketing activities.

- 8. Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office Authority to Expend Program Receipts: \$100.0 GF/PR The Subcommittee approved the authorization for the Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office to utilize program receipts collected from marijuana application and license fees.
- 9. Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office Added Carryforward Language

Carryforward language allows receipts collected in FY16 to be expended in FY17.

The amount appropriated by this appropriation includes the unexpended and unobligated balance on June 30, 2016, of the Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development, Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office, program receipts from the licensing and application fees related to the regulation of marijuana.

# 10. Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office - Added Intent Language

It is the intent of the legislature that the Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development, Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office, set marijuana application and licensing fees to cover the cost of regulation and recover unrestricted general fund appropriations made in prior fiscal years while the program was being established.

11. Alaska Seafood Marketing Institute - Reduced Seafood Marketing Funding: (\$1,028.5)UGF The Subcommittee recommends a decrement in funding in Alaska Seafood Marketing Institute activities, equivalent to 30 percent of the UGF, bringing the total for Seafood Marketing to \$2,399.9.

# 12. Alaska Seafood Marketing Institute – Added Intent Language

It is the intent of the legislature that the Alaska Seafood Marketing Institute develops a plan to phase out reliance on unrestricted general funds for seafood marketing by fiscal year 2019 and continue marketing on industry contributions. Further it is the intent of the legislature the plan includes consideration of increasing revenue from industry contributions to maximum allowed by law and deliver a report to the legislature not later than January 1, 2017.

# 13. Alaska Energy Authority/AIDEA – Added Intent Language

It is the intent of the legislature that the Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development, Alaska Energy Authority and Alaska Industrial Development Export Authority develops a plan to phase out unrestricted general funds for the Alaska Energy Authority by fiscal year 2019, explore further consolidation with the Alaska Industrial Development Export Authority, and deliver a report to the legislature not later than January 1, 2017.

**14.** Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority – Eliminate 2 Positions: (\$266.2) I/A Rcpts Remove one vacant Administrative Assistant position and one Lead Project Manager position.
