Dear Honorable Representatives of the Finance Committee:

When I came of age, I attended UAF as well. My brother, his wife and my husband all graduated from UAF, and now, my oldest son attends UAF.

Budget cuts equate to the loss of programs and leads to many people going ELSEWHERE for their education. Some programs can never compete with specialized schools "Outside", however, it's important to maintain them to a lesser degree so our Alaskan students have a strong foundation to become successful in their field. It would be better to at least have our youth attend in Alaska for their first few years of college, then transfer elsewhere, than to lose them entirely to schools outside. Think of THAT financial loss!

Please reconsider the cuts, and maintain the funding for the University system.
