Analysis

The Division of Banking and Securities (DBS) estimates a fiscal impact of this legislation of personal services costs to add two positions: one Financial Institutions Examiner II and one Business Registration Examiner to administer the program beginning in July 2017. This bill mandates a high level of administrative oversight; other program costs are dependent on the popularity of the 529A accounts for disabled Alaskans and their families.	
The Financial Institutions Examiner and Business Registration Examiner positions will research federal law and regulation, assist with drafting state regulations, and field calls from the public. The Financial Institutions Examiner will conduct examinations of the financial services business administering the 529A, and take or refer enforcement actions. The Business Registration Examiner will provide guidance to businesses regarding state regulations and will review, accept or deny registration applications.	
\$10.0 per position is included for on-going support and overhead costs, and \$5.0 per position is included in the first year for startup costs. Minimal other program costs are anticipated; the division will accommodate those costs within the existing agency budget.	
DBS is funded through General Fund program receipts. Additional authorization to expend program receipts will cover th costs in FY2017 and out years.	e
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
