## FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

"An Act making appropriations for the operating and capital expenses of the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program; making supplemental appropriations; and providing for an effective date."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

(SECTION 1 OF THIS ACT BEGINS ON PAGE 2)

* Section 1. The following appropriation items are for operating expenditures from the
general fund or other funds as set out in section 2 of this Act to the agencies named for the
purposes expressed for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016 and ending June 30, 2017,
unless otherwise indicated. A department-wide, agency-wide, or branch-wide unallocated
reduction set out in this section may be allocated among the appropriations made in this
section to that department, agency, or branch.

- \* Sec. 8. DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES. The sum of \$30,000,000 is appropriated from the general fund to the Department of Health and Social Services, behavioral health, behavioral health treatment and recovery grants, for a pilot program to develop additional substance use disorder services for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2016, June 30, 2017, June 30, 2018, and June 30, 2019.
- \* Sec. 9. NONGENERAL FUND RECEIPTS. (a) Alaska Mental Health Trust Authority authorized receipts (AS 37.14.036) or administration receipts (AS 37.14.036) that exceed the amounts appropriated in this Act are appropriated conditioned upon compliance with the program review provisions of AS 37.07.080(h).
- (b) If Alaska Mental Health Trust Authority authorized receipts (AS 37.14.036) or administration receipts (AS 37.14.036) fall short of the estimates used as the basis of the appropriation, the affected appropriation is reduced by the amount of the shortfall in receipts.
- \* Sec. 10. SALARY AND BENEFIT ADJUSTMENTS. (a) The appropriations made in sec. 1 of this Act include amounts for salary and benefit adjustments for public officials, officers, and employees of the executive branch, Alaska Court System employees, employees of the legislature, and legislators and to implement the terms for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017, of the following ongoing collective bargaining agreements:
- (1) Alaska Correctional Officers Association, representing the correctional officers unit;
  - (2) Public Safety Employees Association;
  - (3) Alaska Vocational Technical Center Teachers' Association;
- (4) Inlandboatmen's Union of the Pacific, Alaska Region, for the unlicensed marine unit;
- (5) International Organization of Masters, Mates, and Pilots, for the masters, mates, and pilots unit.
- (b) The appropriations made to the University of Alaska in sec. 1 of this Act include amounts for salary and benefit adjustments for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017, for university employees who are not members of a collective bargaining unit and to implement the terms for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017, of the following collective bargaining

- (d) If a collective bargaining agreement listed in (b) of this section is not ratified by the membership of the respective collective bargaining unit and approved by the Board of Regents of the University of Alaska, the appropriations made in this Act applicable to the collective bargaining unit's agreement are reduced proportionately by the amount for that collective bargaining agreement, and the corresponding funding source amounts are reduced accordingly.
- (e) Appropriations made in sec. 1 of this Act for salary and benefit adjustments as described in (a) and (b) of this section are for the benefit of the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program only and do not necessarily affect every group of noncovered employees or every collective bargaining unit listed in (a) and (b) of this section.
- \* Sec. 11. RETROACTIVITY. If the appropriation made in sec. 8 of this Act takes effect after April 17, 2016, sec. 8 of this Act is retroactive to April 17, 2016.
  - \* Sec. 12. Section 8 of this Act takes effect April 17, 2016.
  - \* Sec. 13. Except as provided in sec. 12 of this Act, this Act takes effect July 1, 2016.
