I am writing to express my concern about the elimination of the Interpreter Referral Line (IRL) funding. I know the State has less money to work with but there are many other measures that can be taken including trimming the budgets for personal drivers and first class travel, catered Christmas parties, dry cleaning reimbursements and so on. It is important not to eliminate this program. If you were a hearing person living in a deaf dominated world, you would see the magnitude of importance this bears.
