## STATE OF ALASKA 2016 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

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HB281 doubles the education and active practice requirements for licensure as a real estate broker or associate real estate broker. There would be no impact on existing brokers. Licensees and associate brokers who want to upgrade their licenses would be required to prove more education and experience than are currently required.
