Analysis

This legislation amends the definition of gambling to exclude amusement devices that confer tickets or tokens which can be redeemed for toys, candy or electronic novelties offered in the same facility where the amusement devices are located. It also excludes amusement devices that involve manipulating a claw to get merchandise from the machine.
Under the legislation an amusement device includes arcade-style games, pinball, and shooting galleries, but is not a casino-style game such as slot machines.
The Department of Law does not anticipate a fiscal impact.
