Analysis

This legislation requires a vendor to check a person's identification to ensure that the person is over 18 years of age or visually determine that the person is 25 years of age or older before selling a product containing dextromethorphan. A person who is under 18 years of age may obtain a product containing dextromethorphan if they have a prescription issued by a licensed practitioner. A vendor who fails to follow these procedures is guilty of a violation punishable by a fine of \$150 for the first violation and \$250 for the second violation.
