FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

BILL NO. HB 131

Analysis

HB 131 requires a person seeking a manicurist/nail technician license to obtain 250 hours of training from a school of manicuring or hairdressing. The current qualification to obtain a license to perform manicuring is a 12 hour course of instruction in health, safety and hygiene concerning manicuring customers. In addition, it changes the instructor requirements for teaching manicuring.

The board will need to adopt regulations to implement this legislation; however, this regulations project can be combined with an existing project, thus requiring no additional authority.

The Division of Corporations, Business, and Professional Licensing does not anticipate fiscal impact from this legislation.
