



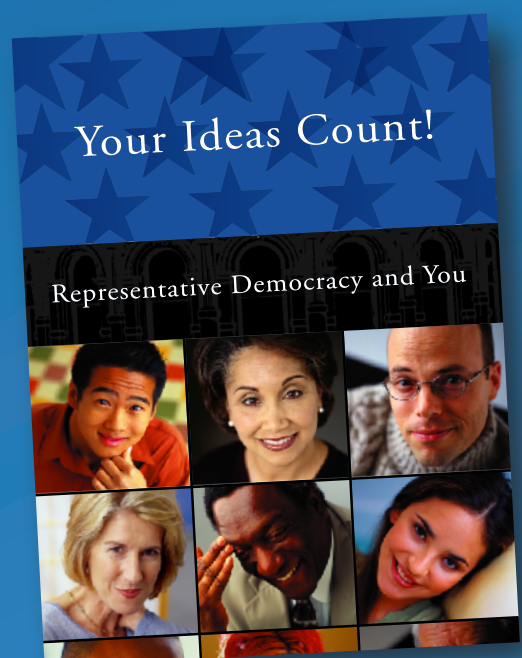

We have materials you can take along when you visit high school, middle/junior high and elementary school students.. We also have videos and an online game. **And they're all free!**



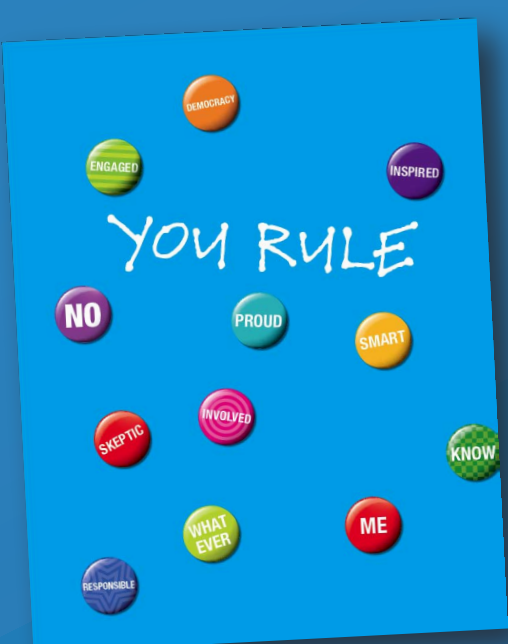
FREE! Your Ideas Count! Representative Democracy and You
