Examples of State Legislative Activity: Nebraska's Unicameral Youth Legislature

- Annual program for high school students
- Four-day simulation where students step into the role of lawmaker – conduct hearings, sponsor bills, debate legislation

Nevada Youth Legislature (NRS 385.515)

- Membership: 21 high school students in 2 yr terms
- Duties: evaluate issues of importance to youth, hold 2 public hearings, public awareness towards youth, each youth legislator hold one meeting, report activities to legislature
- Powers: meet as often as necessary, form committees, periodic seminars on gov't/leadership, draft 1 measure related to youth

Massachusetts Student Government Day




Massachusetts Student Government Day

- Established in 1947, first Friday in April (M.G.L. Chapter 6, Section 12M)
- Dept. of Secondary & Elementary Education with major assistance from the legislature, approx. 400 students participate
- Students are assigned the roles of senators, representatives, constitutional officers and Justices of the Supreme Court.
- "This is an informative program about state government, that includes students participating in the role of elected or appointed officials to observe the processes of government."


Examples of State Legislative Activity: Virginia's Capitol Classroom



- America's Legislators Back to School Program kicks off the third week of September and runs throughout the school year.
- NCSL makes available, free of charge, <u>publication</u> and <u>video</u> resource materials for high school, middle/junior high school and elementary school students to be used by state legislators visiting classrooms in conjunction with the program.
