FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

1 "An Act restricting the publication of certain records of criminal cases on a publicly

2 available Internet website; and providing for an effective date."

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

4 * Section 1. The uncodified law of the State of Alaska is amended by adding a new section
5 to read:

6 LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the legislature that, to the extent 7 practicable, the Alaska Court System remove from its public Internet website records of 8 criminal cases that were disposed of before the effective date of this Act by acquittal of all 9 charges, by dismissal of all charges, or by acquittal of some charges and dismissal of the 10 remaining charges, to the extent that AS 22.35.030, enacted by sec. 2 of this Act, requires that 11 the records may not be published.

12 * Sec. 2. AS 22.35 is amended by adding a new section to read:

Sec. 22.35.030. Records concerning criminal cases resulting in acquittal or
 dismissal. The Alaska Court System may not publish a court record of a criminal case

1	on a publicly available website if 60 days have elapsed from the date of acquittal or
2	dismissal and
3	(1) the defendant was acquitted of all charges filed in the case;
4	(2) all criminal charges against the defendant in the case have been
5	dismissed and were not dismissed as part of a plea agreement in another criminal case
6	under Rule 11, Alaska Rules of Criminal Procedure; or
7	(3) the defendant was acquitted of some of the criminal charges in the
8	case and the remaining charges were dismissed.
9	* Sec. 3. The uncodified law of the State of Alaska is amended by adding a new section to

11	APPLICABILITY. AS 22.35.030, enacted by sec. 2 of this Act, applies to criminal
12	charges concluded on or after the effective date of this Act by dismissal or by acquittal of the
13	defendant.
14	* Sec. 4. This Act takes effect October 1, 2015.
