DRAFT GOALS

- 1. Competent and responsible citizens are informed and thoughtful; have a grasp and an appreciation of history and the fundamental processes of American democracy; have an understanding and awareness of public and community issues; and have the ability to obtain information, think critically, and enter into dialogue among others with different perspectives.
- 2. Competent and responsible citizens participate in their communities through membership in or contributions to organizations working to address an array of cultural, social, political, and religious interests and beliefs.
- 3. Competent and responsible citizens act politically by having the skills, knowledge, and commitment needed to accomplish public purposes, such as group problem solving, public speaking, petitioning and protesting, and voting.
- 4. Competent and responsible citizens have moral and civic virtue such as concern for the rights and welfare of others, social responsibility, tolerance and respect, and belief in the capacity to make a difference.
- 5. Relevant and Active learning opportunities offer students the chance to engage in discussions of issues and take part in activities that can help put a "real life" perspective on what is learned in class. These activities can range from collaborative or independent research projects and presentations to simulations, mock trials and elections, service-learning projects, and participation in the student government.
- 6. Provide teachers with access to professional development in civic education, foster collaboration and networking with other teachers and civic education organizations, and recognize teachers who are doing good work in this area.
