




Child Protection Attorneys

 - Juneau





How many reports go to court? 11%



Court Proceedings of a Child in Need of Aid case



Child Protection Attorney Caseloads






Caseload Averages

Misconception:

OCS profits by taking kids away from their parents.

Fact:

In reality, Alaska is only reimbursed about 35 cent for every AK dollar spent. Child Protective Services is not a money making venture.

Misconception:

Children are rarely returned to their parents.

Fact:

In 2016, over half of the children who left foster care went home to their families.



Misconception: OCS hearings are secret.

Fact:

Most OCS hearings are open to the public and have been since 2015.
