
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Our Wetland Mitigation Bank was the first ever to be certified in Alaska. It is within the boundaries of the Municipality of Anchorage and Eagle River area and is located within the watershed of Eagle River which is dominated by glaciers and rugged, mountainous terrain. The main source of water in Eagle River is formed from melt water from Eagle Glacier, augmented by meltwater from eleven smaller glaciers that feed Eagle River and its tributaries. Eagle River enters Knik Arm of Cook Inlet approximately 40 miles below its source, forming the largest river system within the Municipality of Anchorage. The drainage area of the watershed is reported to cover more than 200 square miles, with approximately 13 square miles occupied by glaciers.

The Harmany Ranch Mitigation Bank can benefit you and your project if you have a wetlands issue to deal with in your design and engineering planning. It will save you years of permitting time and satisfies the Corps of Engineers' requirement for replacing or developing other wetlands for your own project to get approved.
