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FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

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BILL NO.	SB 91	
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Analysis

The bill authorizes the Chief Medical Officer to issue a standing order, including a statewide standing order, for the prescription of an opioid overdose drug through June 30, 2021. The bill also requires an annual report to the legislature of the activities and expenditures. The department believes this can be accomplished with existing resources. The \$4.1 million cost estimate in the Governor's disaster declaration is funded through a current federal Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration grant. No state general funds have been used from the Disaster Relief Fund balance nor will a supplemental appropriation be required; therefore the department submits a zero fiscal note.					

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
