





- Proximity to national interests
- Russian trends & sovereignty implications
-Arctic understanding is a GLOBAL issue





Eielson F-35

- Record of Decision signed 4 Apr 16
- First of 54 Aircraft Arrive in Spring 2020
 - Last Aircraft Arrive in Winter 2022
- Personnel All Additive
 - 1244 military authorizations validated
 - 133 additional in consideration
 - 65-80 Contractors
 - + Dependents
 - Total = ~3500 personnel
