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Analysis

SB38 requires Pharmacy Benefit Managers (PBMs) to register with the director of insurance as third party administrators, and sets procedures PBMs must follow when conducting pharmacy audits. The bill also establishes procedures related to drug pricing, provides for a pharmacy appeal process related to reimbursement of multi-source generic drugs, and allows a pharmacy to request hearing with the director of the Division of Insurance under existing statute following the appeal process.
The Division of Insurance does not anticipate fiscal impact from this legislation.
