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## FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

## STATE OF ALASKA 2017 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. SB 96

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As currently written it is anticipated any cost to the Department of Administration would be de minimis and therefore submits a zero fiscal note.
The bill encourages cooperative arrangements around group health insurance, or self-insurance as outlined in AS 39.30.090 and AS 39.30.091. The bill provides for a one-time cooperative arrangement grant to the school district to assist with the cost of transferring health insurance policies from the existing policies to a group policy under AS 39.30.090 and AS 39.30.091.

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
