## A BILL

## FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

"An Act making appropriations for the operating and capital expenses of the state's

integrated comprehensive mental health program; and providing for an effective date."

# **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:**

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(SECTION 1 OF THIS ACT BEGINS ON PAGE 2)

Section 1. The following appropriation items are for operating expenditures from the general fund or other funds as set out in section 2 of this Act to the agencies named for the purposes expressed for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017 and ending June 30, 2018, unless otherwise indicated. A department-wide, agency-wide, or branch-wide unallocated reduction set out in this section may be allocated among the appropriations made in this section to that department, agency, or branch.

No money appropriated in this appropriation may be expended for an abortion that is not a mandatory service required under AS 47.07.030(a). The money appropriated for Health and Social Services may be expended only for mandatory services required under Title XIX of the Social Security Act and for optional services offered by the state under the state plan for medical assistance that has been approved by the United States Department of Health and Human Services.

\* Sec. 7. PURPOSE. In accordance with AS 37.14.003 and 37.14.005, the appropriations made in this Act are for the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program.

\* Sec. 8. NONGENERAL FUND RECEIPTS. (a) Alaska Mental Health Trust Authority authorized receipts (AS 37.14.036) or administration receipts (AS 37.14.036) that exceed the amounts appropriated in this Act are appropriated conditioned upon compliance with the program review provisions of AS 37.07.080(h).

(b) If Alaska Mental Health Trust Authority authorized receipts (AS 37.14.036) or administration receipts (AS 37.14.036) fall short of the estimates used as the basis of the appropriation, the affected appropriation is reduced by the amount of the shortfall in receipts.
\* Sec. 9. SALARY AND BENEFIT ADJUSTMENTS. (a) The appropriations made in sec. 1 of this Act include amounts for salary and benefit adjustments for public officials, officers,

and employees of the executive branch, Alaska Court System employees, employees of the legislature, and legislators and to implement the terms for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018, of the following ongoing collective bargaining agreements:

(1) Alaska Correctional Officers Association, representing the correctionalofficers unit;

(2) Alaska State Employees Association, for the general government unit;

(3) Alaska Public Employees Association, for the supervisory unit;

(4) Public Employees Local 71, for the labor, trades, and crafts unit;

(5) Alaska Vocational Technical Center Teachers' Association, National
 Education Association, representing the employees of the Alaska Vocational Technical
 Center;

(6) Confidential Employees Association, representing the confidential unit;

(7) Marine Engineers' Beneficial Association, representing licensed engineers
 employed by the Alaska marine highway system;

(8) Teachers Education Association of Mt. Edgecumbe;

(9) Inlandboatmen's Union of the Pacific, Alaska Region, representing the
unlicensed marine unit;

(10) Public Safety Employees Association, representing the regularly
 commissioned public safety officers unit;

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(11) International Organization of Masters, Mates, and Pilots, representing the

masters, mates, and pilots unit.

(b) The appropriations made to the University of Alaska in sec. 1 of this Act include amounts for salary and benefit adjustments for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018, for university employees who are not members of a collective bargaining unit and to implement the terms for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018, of the following collective bargaining agreement: University of Alaska Federation of Teachers (UAFT).

(c) If a collective bargaining agreement listed in (a) of this section is not ratified by the membership of the respective collective bargaining unit, the appropriations made in this Act applicable to the collective bargaining unit's agreement are reduced proportionately by the amount for that collective bargaining agreement, and the corresponding funding source amounts are reduced accordingly.

(d) If a collective bargaining agreement listed in (b) of this section is not ratified by the membership of the respective collective bargaining unit and approved by the Board of Regents of the University of Alaska, the appropriations made in this Act applicable to the collective bargaining unit's agreement are reduced proportionately by the amount for that collective bargaining agreement, and the corresponding funding source amounts are reduced accordingly.

(e) Appropriations made in sec. 1 of this Act for salary and benefit adjustments as described in (a) and (b) of this section are for the benefit of the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program only and do not necessarily affect every group of noncovered employees or every collective bargaining unit listed in (a) and (b) of this section.
 \* Sec. 10. This Act takes effect July 1, 2017.

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
