## FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

## STATE OF ALASKA 2017 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

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This legislation proposes an amendment to the Constitution of the State of Alaska that would limit the regular session of the legislature from one hundred twenty days to not later than ninety consecutive calendar days from the date it convenes.
Passage of this resolution would require the constitutional amendment to appear on the 2018 general election ballot. The cost of providing information about the constitutional amendment in the Official Election Pamphlet, as required by AS 15.58, would be absorbed into the operating budget for the Division of Elections.

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
