FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2017 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

This bill will correct errors and properly describe areas intended for habitat protection; eliminate the confusing patchwork of land status within these refuges and critical habitat areas; create contiguous, inclusive boundaries that better reflect the original legislative intent of the designations; remove lands inadvertently included in critical habitat areas that were not appropriate for habitat protections, and eliminate permitting requirements for such lands; and clarify management and enforcement of the applicable statutes and regulations governing the subject special areas.
The division does not anticipate any additional costs as management of the additional or shifted lands falls within our normal scope of work.
