### STATE OF ALASKA 2017 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. HB 200

## **Analysis**

This legislation proposes to implement a top two primary system for state and national offices. The top two vote recipients for each office would advance to the general election, regardless of party affiliation. There are numerous other sections of statute being revised as a result of the structural change of the primary. These include election worker appointments, information printed on ballot, and information to voters regarding the new system. The bill proposes to repeal the special runoff election for the office of US senator or US representative. The bill proposes conducting a special primary before the special election to fill the vacancy in the office of Congress, Governor and state legislature The bill proposes additional information be published in the Official Election Pamphlet regarding the candidates appearing on the ballot and how they got there. The bill would repeal statutes relevant to the current primary system process regarding candidates. The bill proposes to change the requirements for obtaining recognized political party status and removes the requirements for the party to submit by-laws to the division. The bill proposes to change the qualifications for an individual who is appointed to fill a vacant legislative seat. There would be a fiscal impact for holding a special election. However, those provisions are already in place and if a special election was to be called, a special appropriation would need to be received.
