Greetings Alaska Lawmakers,

I want to express my strong belief (as an economist with 30 years experience in Alaska) that the State fiscal situation can be best fixed by a combination of actions. Those include restructuring and using part of the Permanent Fund earnings (but not above 5%, lest we deplete it), an income tax (for its progressive and inclusive nature), budget cuts (but not so much that it further impacts the economy through job losses), and increases in other taxes, such as fuel taxes and taxes on the oil industry.
