I would like to ask you to consider how the plan to create a PFD Lottery as set out in SB78 may negatively impact the vital Alaskan non-profit safety network:

- As a charitable nonprofit in Homer, we rely on unrestricted funds collected through the Pick Click Give program to deliver essential services in our community. The amount we receive may be modest, but the connections we make with new donors can be the beginning of a lifetime of critically important support.
- Kachemak Bay Family Planning Clinic is a member supported organization that provides broad access to reproductive health care services and education in a supportive and empowering environment. The R.E.C. Room mission is to facilitate healthy relationships, health education and healthy choices for youth in Homer.

This bill may jeopardize our ability to further these missions and specifically to provide such things as peer-led health education, essential reproductive health services and youth resources & support to our community. As you know we provide these programs and services regardless of the participants ability to pay.

- There has been no study of the impact of a PFD Lottery on our ability to remain connected to donors through Pick.Click.Give. We urge you to collect data on the impact on the state's charitable sector if residents are given an option to allocate their dividend towards a lottery. Perhaps a study or a task force.
- Please demand data before advancing SB78!
