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FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2017 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

This legislation adds the requirement to include within the basic training curriculum for probation officer, parole officer, and correctional officer the training required to: recognize people with disabilities; training for appropriate interactions with persons with disabilities; resources available to persons with disabilities and to those interacting with persons with disabilities; and the requirements of Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act, 42 U.S.C. 12131-12165.					
The Department's current correctional and probation/parole officer academies include these topic as part of the basic certification process for all probation officers, parole officers, and correctional officers. The Department anticipates that this legislation should have no increased fiscal impact if passed.					

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
