STATE OF ALASKA
2017 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**Analysis**

This legislation adds the requirement to include within the basic training curriculum for probation officer, parole officer, and correctional officer the training required to: recognize people with disabilities; training for appropriate interactions with persons with disabilities; resources available to persons with disabilities and to those interacting with persons with disabilities; and the requirements of Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act, 42 U.S.C. 12131-12165.

The Department's current correctional and probation/parole officer academies include these topic as part of the basic certification process for all probation officers, parole officers, and correctional officers . The Department anticipates that this legislation should have no increased fiscal impact if passed.
