Department of Environmental Conservation Share of Total Agency Operations (GF Only) (\$ Thousands)




Department of Environmental Conservation Line Items (All Funds) (\$ Thousands)

The majority of FY18 funding in DEC is comprised of the following two line items: Personal Services--68% Services--25%






Appropriations within the Department of Environmental Conservation (All Funds)





Appropriations within the Department of Environmental Conservation (GF Only) (\$ Thousands)






Department of Environmental Conservation Total Funding Comparison by Fund Group (All Funds) (\$ Thousands)
