A RESOLUTION

- 1 Proclaiming February 2018 as Black History Month.
- 2 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE:
- WHEREAS we recognize the strength and value of our diversity as a state and nation;
- 4 and
- 5 **WHEREAS** the birthdays of Fredrick Douglass and Abraham Lincoln inspired Dr.
- 6 Carter G. Woodson, considered the "Father of Black History," to establish Negro History
- 7 Week, which later became Black History Month; and
- 8 WHEREAS African Americans are woven into the fabric of this nation and contribute
- 9 to the attributes that make the nation strong and just, despite the nation's history of their
- 10 enslavement and unjust treatment; and
- WHEREAS the pivotal role African Americans have played in building this great
- state has been uncelebrated for too long; and
- WHEREAS many African American residents have helped shape our state's destiny,
- including Blanche McSmith who, in 1959, after leading efforts to advance civil rights in the
- period leading up to statehood, was appointed the first African American to serve in the
- Alaska House of Representatives, where she fought tirelessly to end housing and employment

2	WHEREAS Mahala Ashley Dickerson, after moving to Alaska to homestead with her
3	family, became the state's first African American attorney in 1959 and continued to fight for
4	equal rights for all into her 90s; and
5	WHEREAS our nation was founded on the principle that "all men are created equal,
6	that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are
7	Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness"; and
8	WHEREAS we have struggled through slavery, segregation, and racial injustice
9	toward this ideal and are still fighting today to fulfill the promise of those words;
10	BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate proclaims February 2018 as Black History
11	Month.
