Analysis

This bill amends statutes relating to protective orders by creating a new “gun violence protective order” and requiring such orders to be entered in the central registry of protective orders maintained by the Department of Public Safety (DPS) in the Alaska Public Safety Information Network (APSIN).

Passage of this bill would require programming of APSIN to allow entry of the new gun violence protective orders. DPS would work with the Alaska Court System to develop gun violence protective order forms and would make programming changes in APSIN to allow gun violence protective order form data entry. This is expected to take a contractor approximately 200 hours at \$140/hour to complete for a total of \$28,000.

As the bill is currently written, gun violence protective orders do not meet the federal prohibitions under 18 USC 922(g) relating to possession and transfer of a firearm and they would not be entered into the FBI's National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS) which is used by Federal Firearms Licensees (FFLs) to instantly determine whether a prospective buyer is eligible to buy firearms. If this bill is amended to create a state prohibition to possessing a firearm during the duration of a gun violence protective order, additional programming would be required to allow the automated entry of the information into NICS and this fiscal note would need to be amended.
