## **Analysis**

SB38 requires Pharmacy Benefit Managers (PBMs) to register with the director of the Division of Insurance as third party administrators, and sets procedures PBMs must follow when conducting pharmacy audits. The bill also establishes procedures related to drug pricing, provides for a pharmacy appeal process related to reimbursement of multi-source generic drugs, and allows a pharmacy to request hearing with the director of the Division of Insurance under existing statute following the appeal process.
The registration process would require more work from the Licensing and Financial Examiners but the additional workload can to be absorbed by current staff.
The language in the bill provides that the appeals process would be provided by the Office of Administrative Hearings and not the Division of Insurance.
The Division of Insurance does not anticipate fiscal impact from this legislation.

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
