### A BILL

# FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

"An Act prohibiting groups controlled by a legislator from soliciting and accepting
contributions or from making certain contributions and expenditures during a regular
or special legislative session; and prohibiting some lobbyists from making campaign
contributions to certain groups."

# **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:**

\* Section 1. AS 15.13.072 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

(i) \_A group controlled by a <u>member of the legislaturelegislator</u> may not solicit or accept a contribution<del>, or make a contribution or expenditure,</del> for the purpose of influencing the outcome of an election under this chapter while the legislature is convened in a regular or special legislative session.

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who organize for the principal purpose of influencing the outcome of one or more elections and who take action the major purpose of which is to influence the outcome of an election; a group that makes expenditures or receives contributions with the authorization or consent, express or implied, or under the control, direct or indirect, of a candidate shall be considered to be controlled by that candidate; a group whose major purpose is to further the nomination, election, or candidacy of only one individual, or intends to expend more than 50 percent of its money on a single candidate, shall be considered to be controlled by that candidate and its actions done with the candidate's knowledge and consent unless, within 10 days from the date the candidate learns of the existence of the group the candidate files with the commission, on a form provided by the commission, an affidavit that the group is operating without the candidate's control; a group organized for more than one year preceding an election and endorsing candidates for more than one office or more than one political party is presumed not to be controlled by a candidate; however, a group that contributes more than 50 percent of its money to or on behalf of one candidate shall be considered to support only one candidate for purposes of AS 15.13.070, whether or not control of the group has been disclaimed by the candidate; and

(C) any combination of two or more individuals acting jointly who organize for the principal purpose of filing an initiative proposal application under AS 15.45.020 or who file an initiative proposal application under AS 15.45.020;

(9) "immediate family" means the spouse, parent, child, including a stepchild and an adopted child, and sibling of an individual;

(10) "independent expenditure" means an expenditure that is made without the direct or indirect consultation or cooperation with, or at the suggestion or the request of, or with the prior consent of, a candidate, a candidate's campaign treasurer or deputy campaign treasurer, or another person acting as a principal or agent of the candidate;

(11) "individual" means a natural person;
