FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA

BILL NO. HB 28

Analysis

This bill would require manufacturers of cosmetics offered for retail sale in the state to disclose the full list of ingredients of the cosmetic on the manufacturer's website. Failure to disclose would be a prohibited act under the Alaska Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act. The Department would have the responsibility to enforce this provision.

This fiscal note assumes that given the Department's current staffing and resources, enforcement would be complaint driven. Complaint resolution would be conducted by existing staff who already respond to a variety of public health complaints as part of their current duties.

Based on the assumption that the Department would not receive a significant number of complaints, there would be no fiscal impact to the Department.
