A system of insurance that protects workers and employers from some of the losses caused by on-the-job accidents and job-related illnesses




The "Grand Bargain"

An employer provides prompt, necessary medical and wage loss benefits to an injured worker for a work-related injury.

In exchange, the injured worker receives limited benefits and gives up the right to sue the employer.




Employment in Alaska 1 Alaska Injury Frequency

Compensation Payments








2019 NCCI Proposed Workers' Compensation Rate Reduction

- 17.5% decrease assigned risk rates, 14.8% decrease voluntary loss costs
- Signifies a positive downward trend in reduced workers' compensation losses
- If approved, would be biggest year-to-year decrease in workers' compensation rates in 40 years
